County of Camden	This funding will support a Joint Special Operations Facility in Camden County. This facility will function as a backup Emergency Operations Center, provide storage for emergency apparatus, and serve as a specialized training site for special operations personnel. Borough of Carlstadt	This funding supports the construction of a bioretention basin to alleviate chronic flooding along Broad St. in Carlstadt. This would promote sustainable stormwater management & greatly improve outdated infrastructure.	Carlstadt NJ	\$1,099
City of Englewood	This funding will be used to relocate the current Englewood Communications Center (ECC) to a new building; upgrade the ECC's radio equipment, consoles, as well as to conduct needed renovations. This project will improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the ECC and the safety of Englewood City.	Englewood NJ	\$1,875
Stockton University	This funding supports the renovation of an existing facility to bring it into compliance and to expand the existing facility to include a comprehensive emergency operations center for related emergency healthcare responders. This will improve coordination and response times during emergencies.	Galloway NJ	\$3,741
Borough of Hamburg	This funding will be for the acquisition of a portable emergency generator that aims to ensure continuous operation of water and sewer infrastructure during power outages and provide critical backup power to maintain essential services for residents and visitors.	Hamburg NJ	\$221
Borough of Highlands	This projects supports the construction & installation of stormwater infrastructure throughout the Borough of Highlands and neighboring Monmouth Hills. The proposed project will mitigate on-going flooding and sediment runoff, improve public safety & safeguard public infrastructure from flood events.	Highlands NJ	\$12,194
Township of Hopewell	This funding supports the purchase of updated technology to respond to emergency calls. The requested technology will bolster the operations of the local Township Police Department, ensuring its equipment is dependable and meets the community's growing public safety needs.
