Dear Senators Kim, Collins, Gillibrand, and McCormick:

AARP, which advocates on behalf of 125 million Americans age 50 and older and their families, is pleased to endorse the *Senior Security Act of 2026*. We appreciate your bipartisan leadership and commitment to combating the financial exploitation of older Americans.

AARP has a long history of fighting to protect older Americans from fraud and has been at the forefront of advocacy in support of federal and state laws and regulations that prevent financial exploitation and scams targeting seniors. Along with these legislative efforts, the AARP Fraud Watch Network empowers consumers to protect themselves, their families, and their communities from fraud and scams, and provides tips to spot and avoid identity theft, investment fraud, and a range of popular scams.

The Senior Security Act would create a taskforce at the Securities and Exchange Commission to examine and identify challenges that senior investors face. The legislation also calls for the U.S. Government Accountability Office to study and report on the economic costs of the financial exploitation of seniors. The report would specifically examine relevant trends and innovations — like robocalls and voice spoofing — that are affecting senior investors, helping policymakers and advocates stay ahead of changes in financial scams as they arise.

Criminals steal billions of dollars from consumers every year. The effects on victims and their families can be financially and emotionally devastating, especially for older Americans. AARP is pleased to support your legislation to fight back against fraud and scams and we look forward to working with you and your colleagues to enact the Senior Security Act into law.
